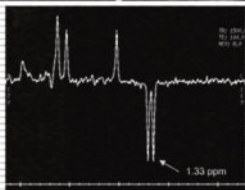
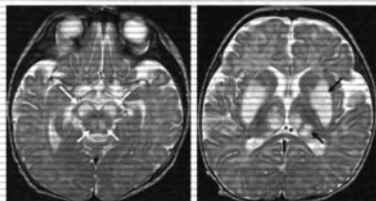
Introduction

Welcome to the *BMJ Journals* userguide. This guide will take you through the useful features and functions of our *BMJ Journals* Online Collection.

At journals.bmj.com, you can read articles before they are published in print and search the archive using keywords, citations or author's name. You can find articles relevant to your interests and have them emailed to you or share articles with colleagues through the 'email a friend' feature.

Our journal websites are hosted on HighWire Press, the electronic imprint of Stanford University Libraries. HighWire Press produces the online version of over 1,000 high-impact, peer-reviewed journals and other scholarly content for publishers across the world.

Key features of the BMJ Journals Collection

- Browse the current issue – it's easy to read the current issue online. Click the journal cover (1) or the 'Current issue' link (2).
- Searching – There are two ways to search a *BMJ Journals* website:
 - the quick search box (3)
 - the 'Advanced Search' link on the homepage (4)

All methods search the current issue and the archive.

- Linked references – You benefit from free access to the full text of cited articles from any of the journals (1000+) hosted by HighWire Press.
- Online first – You can read articles before they are published in print. Click on the 'Online first' link (5).
- Email alerts – You can receive a variety of email alerts. To sign up, click on the 'Register for email alerts' (6). This is a free service but you'll have to register first.
- Archive – All *BMJ Journals* websites have an archive of previous issues right back to volume 1, issue 1. Every article published before 2006 is free (non-subscribers will need to complete a one time registration). Use the 'Archive' link to see the archive (7).
- Submission and review – Our submission and review process is entirely online. Click on the 'Submit a paper' (8). For author information, click on 'Instructions for Authors'.
- Personalisation – 'My folders' allows you to save interesting articles and searches into your personal folders. Click on 'My folders' link (9).

- Get social - find each Journal on Facebook and Twitter to read articles, get live updates, leave your comments, share and flag up content you like. Click on 'Follow us on twitter' or 'Become a fan' (10).
- Blogs & podcast – Some *BMJ Journals* enable you to contribute to the debate on our editors' blog or listen to and download podcasts on hot topics.

Other useful features

- Article formats – Articles are available as abstracts, extracts, full text, HTML or PDFs. Abstracts and extracts are available to non-subscribers.
- Browse by topic – All articles are assigned to topic areas, making it easy to search across more than one journal.
- Track topics, papers or authors – Sign up for our CiteTrack service and we'll let you know by email whenever new content in your chosen journal is published.
- RSS Feeds – Receive automatic updates every time the website is updated by our RSS feeds.
- Submit a response – Use the 'Submit a response' link to send your comments on any article published in a *BMJ Journal* and, if suitable, they will be published on the site within 1 working day.
- PowerPoint slides – Images in full text articles can be downloaded as PowerPoint slides for teaching purposes.
- Email a friend – Recommend an article to a friend using this free feature, available on any abstract, full text or PDF.
- Feedback – To give us your feedback on the site or if you have general queries, click the 'Feedback' button at the bottom of any page.
- PubMed – Search 21 million citations for biomedical abstracts from MEDLINE, life science journals, and online books.
- Citation manager – Author harvesting of references.
- Citation map – See a visual representation of the articles citing or cited by your selected article.

- Data supplements – Free additional material online that doesn't appear in the print journal. Look out for additional tables, references, videos, images etc.
- New features - We now have "Add to Mendeley" and Google+1 buttons on all *BMJ* articles amongst other new and exciting features such as Library Branding, Article Usage Metrics and Scopus citation links.

Extra online features available on BMJ

- Continuous publishing – *BMJ* is continuously updated online with articles being available as soon as they have been peer reviewed and edited.
- Unique articles – selected articles may only be available online.
- Rapid responses – read and contribute to *BMJ* articles via our electronic letters service.
- Search – user advanced search to find any *BMJ* article dating back to 1840.
- Enhance your presentations – turn illustrations from *BMJ* articles into PowerPoint slides.
- Free citation linking – if an article referenced by *BMJ* is published by one of HighWire's 1,000 journals you'll be able to view it for free.
- Topics – 300+ clinical and non clinical topic collections including everything the *BMJ* has published in your speciality.
- Regular polls, blogs, videos and podcasts.
- Combining the best of print and online, *BMJ* is also available as an iPad app and was the first general medical journal to launch a version for Apple's tablet computer.
